ala Devi Chandrashekar will present her latest production – Mauli - A Timeless Tradition, at various venues in Chennai.

'Mauli...', an ode to the Pandharpur heritage, is conceived and choreographed by Bala Devi. The production highlights the timeless values of equality and devotion that form the heart of the Varkari sampradaya. Symbolically retracing the 250-km wari from Alandi and Dehu to Pandharpur, the work follows the journey of various saint-poets of the abhang tradition and Varkari pilgrims.

Based in Princeton, New Jersey, Bala Devi is a senior disciple of veteran dancer-scholar Padma Subrahmanyam.

Her well-known productions include 'Nandanar Charithram', 'KrishnaArpanam', 'Tripura - Divine Feminine', 'Karna - Destiny's Child', 'Brihadeeswara Form to Formless', 'Maa - The Eternal Truth', 'An ode to Thanjavur Quartet' and 'Padmavati -An Avatar'. The dancer has performed across the globe, including UNESCO Headquarters in Paris and cultural showcases for Paris Olympics 2024.
